Dear Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the 2009 Harvard Ukrainian Summer Institute. Enclosed you will find an announcement about our academic program, an application form and a checklist. This year's program includes courses in the Ukrainian language (3 levels), Ukrainian linguistics, literature, and history. In addition to high-quality and intensive instruction in Ukrainian Studies, HUSI offers a full range of extracurricular events. Students have access to Harvard's extensive resources, including the largest Ukrainian library collection outside of Eastern Europe, many museums and athletic facilities. Students also have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the work carried out at the Ukrainian Research Institute, meet with its associates, and use its library. A summer at Harvard is a memorable and enriching experience.

Application to the Harvard Ukrainian Summer Institute (HUSI) is a two-step process:

- The first step is the submission of the enclosed HUSI application form and supporting materials that are to be sent to the Ukrainian Research Institute (HURI) care of Tamara Nary, Program Administrator, Harvard Ukrainian Summer Institute.
- The second step is the submission of the Harvard Summer School Application/Registration form, \$50 nonrefundable processing fee (payable to Harvard Summer School) and Housing Application form (if applicable) that are also to be sent directly to HURI for Ms. Nary's HUSI application files. These forms may be obtained directly from the Harvard Summer School web site at <http://www.summer.harvard.edu> or from the Harvard Summer School catalogue and will be available after February 1st.

Admission decisions are based on your essay, academic record and letter of recommendation. Participants in the HUSI program who are on scholarship are required to register for a minimum of eight units of credit and may register for a maximum of twelve units of credit. If you are planning to enroll in a Ukrainian language course, you should register for the level you think will be most appropriate for your skill level. A placement examination will be given on the first day of classes to determine final language level placements.

The Harvard Ukrainian Summer Institute offers a reduced tuition of \$2,970 for eight units of credit (full tuition through the Harvard Summer School in 2009 is \$4,950). A *limited* number of tuition scholarships are available. **Applicants who wish to apply for a scholarship must submit along with their completed HUSI application a one-page statement explaining their need for reduced tuition.** (Applicants may also submit copies of any relevant supporting financial documents, such as income tax returns or financial aid applications.) In addition to applying for Ukrainian Summer Institute tuition scholarships, we encourage you to inquire about grants at your home degree-granting institution. Many of our graduate students have applied successfully for the Foreign Language Area Studies (FLAS) fellowships.

Other financial aid may be available from the following sources:

- Pell grants
- PLUS loans
- Perkins loans
- SEOG (Supplemental Education Opportunity Grants)
- Stafford loans

- SLC (Supplemental Loan for Students)
- Merit awards or scholarships from home institution

For those who are not in a degree-granting program at this time, TERI Alternative loans are available through the Harvard Summer School. We urge you to apply early so that you will meet your financial-aid application deadlines.

The final application deadline for students who can pay full tuition and fees and who have no visa requirements is **May 26, 2009**. All applicants requesting financial assistance and/or F-1 visas must apply by **March 16, 2009**. (***Please note: this is the date by which your HUSI application must be received!***)

As is always the case with any deadline, we urge you to send application materials as early as possible *before* the specified deadlines. Notification of admission to the HUSI program will begin after April 1, 2009.

Once accepted by the Harvard Ukrainian Summer Institute, students will receive a letter with further instruction regarding tuition, housing, and health insurance.

It will be our pleasure to welcome you at the 2009 Harvard Ukrainian Summer Institute. As a supplement to our usual program, there are a number of excursions organized by the Harvard Summer School at a minimal additional cost. Outings in the past have included trips to Tanglewood (summer home of the Boston Symphony), Nantucket, and Newport (Rhode Island). Each week there is a rich offering of free films and concerts, dramatic productions, as well as the program of lectures and cultural events run through the Ukrainian Summer Institute. A special aspect of the Harvard Ukrainian Summer Institute is the participation of students from Ukraine. It provides our language students a valuable opportunity to communicate with native speakers and to learn about life in contemporary Ukraine.

We genuinely hope to see you this summer.
